- Reforest Lakeside Park
- Community education workshops at Mayville Library in April
 - April 5: Site assessment and choosing the right tree
 - April 12: Basic tree planting and care
 - April 19: Basic pruning
 - April 26: Plant a tree for Arbor Day at library
- Establish Mayville as a Tree City USA (eligible for grants)
- Establish an annual Arbor Day ceremony and planting
- Establish a memorial tree program (fundraiser)
