To get involved, simply visit one of these local Mayville businesses to collect your clean-up supplies (such as gloves and garbage bags):

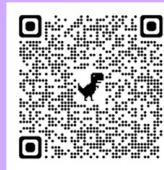

Village Garbage Bags

Small Bags: \$7.00/5 bags

Large Bags: \$10.00/5 bags

Garbage collection is scheduled every Monday morning. Make sure to place your garbage in a village bag by the roadside before 7am. If a holiday falls on a Monday, garbage collection will be moved to the following Tuesday.

Garbage bags can be purchased at the Clerk's Office and the Recycling Center using cash or check, or Tops using cash, check, or card.

The Mayville Tree Committee reserved the library meeting room in April for four 45-minute workshops starting at **10:15 a.m.**

The Cornell Cooperative Extension Master Gardener program will direct the workshops under the L.E.A.F. (Learn, Empower, Achieve, Farm) programs as follows:

- April 6:** Site Assessment and Choosing the Right Tree
- April 13:** Basic Tree Planting and Care
- April 20:** Basic Pruning
- April 27:** Apply what we learned and actually plant a tree

New Rules for Yard Waste Brush, Limb & Grass Clipping Collection



- Limbs and branches are collected on the first and third Monday of each month.
- Limbs/branches should be no longer than 10' and 6" in diameter, cut from trees or shrubs. No whole trees are accepted.
- Please place all limbs and branches neatly stacked parallel with the street, with the butt end facing the direction of traffic.
- Yard waste such as grass clippings, garden waste, weeds, twigs, and tree droppings will be picked up every Monday.
- Remember to use a plastic container with a lid or drain holes for your yard waste - no plastic bags permitted.
- Your containers must be placed by the street on Sunday evening or before 7:30 am on Monday.
- Please be aware that any yard waste not in containers will not be collected.

Open Burning: Part 1

Burning ban in effect from March 16 through May 14 via NY DEC management policy

Allowed:

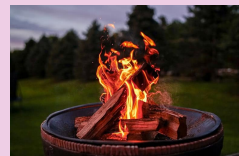
- 1. Recreational Fires:** Enjoy a cozy fire up to 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height for various purposes like relaxation, cooking, or warmth.
- 2. Bonfires:** Experience larger fires for ceremonies (permit may be required).
- 3. Portable Outdoor Fireplaces:** Safely contain solid fuel with a non-combustible design, featuring a door opening and chimney for outdoor enjoyment.

Not Allowed:

- 1. Burning for Disposal:** This includes a wide range of items such as trash, garbage, refuse, waste, carcasses, leaves, clothing/textiles, chemicals, plastics, oils, tires, and petroleum products.
- 2. During windy conditions more than 5 mph**
